“The Prime Minister of Heaven”

Here's a question worth sitting with: What if Jesus was doing something at Caesarea Philippi His disciples would have instantly recognised — and we've almost forgotten how to see?

Follow the thread. In Isaiah 22, God fires a corrupt royal steward, Shebna, and gives the key of the House of David to Eliakim instead. He wears it on his shoulder. What he opens, no one shuts; what he shuts, no one opens. This is the office of prime minister — the man who runs the kingdom in the king's name. Seven centuries later, Jesus asks at Caesarea Philippi: “Who do you say that I am?” Peter answers by revelation: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Jesus is deliberately invoking the Davidic kingdom — Isaiah 22, Matthew 16, and the covenant together — as the key to what happens next.

As Son of David, Jesus is not merely master of the palace; He is the King Himself, free to bestow His kingdom's keys on whomever He wills. He gives them to Peter — an authority even greater than Eliakim's, since Peter becomes chief steward not of a small Near Eastern kingdom, but of the house of great David's greater Son.

This is no improvisation. It is a formal installation. The Church is a divine household with a steward appointed to govern in the King's name. And because Isaiah 22 is itself about succession from one steward to the next, the office Peter receives must be one that continues after him — for if Christ's Church is to last more than a generation, someone must succeed Peter in it.

Paul, overwhelmed, breaks into song: “Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!” (Romans 11:33). That's not filler — it's the only fitting response to seeing the whole design cohere, from Abraham to Isaiah to Peter to now. The keys still exist. The steward still serves. The gates of the netherworld have not prevailed. And the question Jesus asked on that hillside is still the one every soul must answer — not with words only, but with a life. “Who do you say that I am?”

You Are the Rock: Now Act Like It

Peter didn't earn the keys of the Kingdom through cleverness or credentials. He received them through revelation — a gift from the Father, not the work of flesh and blood. And that changes everything.

The first reading sets the stage: God transfers the "key of the House of David" from one steward, Shebna, to another, Eliakim — not because Eliakim was more powerful, but because God chose him. Authority in God's household has always been a matter of divine appointment, not popular election. Then comes Matthew's great moment at Caesarea Philippi. "Who do you say that I am?" is not a trivia question. It is **the question**, the one every human soul must answer, in every age, including this one. Peter's answer, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God," didn't rise from human reasoning. It was breathed into him by the Father. And on that confession, Jesus builds His Church. Not on a system, not on a philosophy — on a person and a faith.

The gates of the netherworld shall not prevail. That is not a hope. That is a promise.

Paul, overwhelmed by the sheer depth of it all, breaks into a doxology in Romans. Some truths are so vast they cannot be argued — they can only be adored. The wisdom and knowledge of God are unsearchable. His ways are beyond tracing out. Yet here we are — held in those ways, kept by that wisdom, loved by that God. The question echoes across the centuries: "Who do you say that I am?" What you answer — and how you live that answer — is everything.
